Literary Devices Picture Frame

<u>Literary Devices are what writers use in order to be more descriptive.</u>

Symbolism: Showing objects or people that represent something else. For example: The American flag is symbolic for freedom. Firefighters are symbolic for bravery. Analogy: A comparison is made between two pairs by saying, "_____ is to __ as _____ is to _____ For example: Sharks are to fish as monkeys are to bananas. Sarah is to playing the violin as Einstein is to mathematic equations. Simile: A comparison is made between two things by using the words like or as. For example; Beth is like a broken record that continuously repeats itself. My dog is as fluffy as warm towels fresh out of the dryer. **Metaphor:** A comparison is made by saying that someone or something is something else. For example: When Bruce wakes up in the morning, he is a monster. The students became a pack of wild animals when the teacher left the Sroom. Alliteration: This is when many words start with the same letter. For example: Peter Piper picked a peck of pickled peppers. The gracious girls always giggle when they go to Grandma's garage.

<u>Directions</u>: you will create a literary devices frame that will include a different literary device in each area of the frame.

- 1. Area 1 Middle will include your name and some symbols that represent who you are and what you enjoy.
- 2. Area 2 Top will include an analogy about yourself
- 3. Area 3 Left will include a simile about yourself
- 4. Area 4 Right will include a metaphor about yourself
- 5. Area 5 Bottom will include an alliteration about something you enjoy
- 6. You must illustrate and color a picture for each area.
